Social distancing—How are we doing?



"We are being asked to do things in a way that we never would have thought possible." Greetings from my home on this beautiful spring day. I am sure a lot of you are like me and getting a jump on your spring chores. New life is showing up in some areas that you expected and in other areas you didn't.

Since we last spoke our world has seen some changes of its own, we are seeing a different kind of new growth, in ourselves, in our community, and perhaps in our own family.

One of the many things that an Interim minister is charged with is to get the Church that he or she is serving to look at new ways that they can be church. Where is God calling them to be? And how is God calling them? And how shall they respond?

I think it is safe to say that no one saw this Covid-19 thing coming! We are being challenged in how we can be "Church" - how to be a community of faith, together but apart.

My guess is that eight months ago when I started

here, that if I said we will have to rely on recorded sermons, phone calls instead of meeting in person, that the kitchen would be used for making meals for those who in our community who don't know where there next meal is coming from, that just perhaps you would have said "No Way!" Well here we are, having to do things we never thought we would have to do. And quess what, we are doing it. We might not be delighted with it, but we are doing it. My guess is that we are operating way outside our comfort zone. We are being asked to do things in a way that we never would have thought possible. And guess what? We are even doing things different than "the way we always have," and we are doing okay for the most part.

We had to start this "social distancing" thing about two weeks into Lent. I don't know about you, but for me I find this rather on point. Think about it: Lent is when Jesus went into the wilderness and fasted for 40 days; Lent is when we are encouraged to look back at our lives and repent /change direction in our lives. Do we need anything more than what we are going through right now to see that perhaps we can do better, do different, be different, look at our world, our community, with fresh eyes.

We can either learn from all of this, or when we get "back to normal" we can forget what changes we had to make, ignore the lessons we have learned, or we can embrace what has happened and truly be a resurrected people, a changed people. We have proven to ourselves that we can change if we want or need to. Welcome to the Interim Ministry process!!

The weekly bulletin - not just another piece of paper

Several years ago, I wrote the following article. I've brushed it up a little for the present.

Each week we get a bulletin that tells us the order of worship. And after the service, it is discarded or maybe even recycled.

Consider taking it home and using it as a daily prayer guide. Pick a different section each day to read and pray over and to reflect on its meaning in your life. In addition to several small prayers, you can reflect on the doxology, the Gloria Patri, and the dedication. Of course, the scripture can be read and there's the Lord's Prayer. The music is usually tied to the service, so even if you aren't musical, you can contemplate the poetry of the hymns.

Use your bulletin to jump start a meaningful conversation, or prayer, with God.

The bulletin is available weekly, in conjunction with Pastor Kerry's recorded sermons. Read the scriptures before listening to the sermons, for added depth. Most music is recorded and often can be found on-line.

With a little bit of preparation, we can have a "whole service" experience!

Until we can be together in person, we can worship together in spirit.






