The Message offers a classic confession of our human struggle against sin:

Leader: I know that all God's commands are spiritual,

People: Out loud, but muted

but I'm not.

I decide one way,

People: Out loud, but muted

but then I act another, doing things I absolutely despise.

I decide to do good,

People: Out loud, but muted

but I don't really do it;

I decide not to do bad,

People: Out loud, but muted

but then I do it anyway

I truly delight in God's commands

People: Out loud, but muted

But the power of sin sabotages my best intentions

My decisions to do good don't result in actions:

People: Out loud, but muted

Sin is there to trip me up.

I've tried everything ...

People: Out loud, but muted

Who can help me?

Invite silence for a time to ponder the contradictions of our lives, and our need for God's generous grace.

SILENT PRAYER ... in the name of Jesus Christ we pray. Amen.
