Looking Ahread

"Who do they say I am?"



"The Church is not someplace you go; it is a community..." So, as we have been reading the Gospel of Matthew for most of the month of August, one of them has stood out for me. If any of you have listened to the sermon on the 23rd, you will know that this is the one!, "Who do they say I am?" and better yet who do you say I am? It may be that I am stretching it some here, but here goes.

I have been reading a lot this summer and one of the books I just finished is Christianity Beyond Belief, Following Jesus for the sake of others by Todd D. Hunter. In it he talks a lot of the Christian community, what does it mean, and what doers it mean to us or you?

One of the comparisons he makes is to first responders, how they are trained to run towards a crisis instead of away from it. When we see them in action on the news we might think as Hunter says "Wow, they are really living in their story; they are faithfully acting their part." They respond for the sake of others; they are models for how the

ambassadors of the kingdom of God should respond to the world.

I think God would envision something like that for the church. N.T. Wright said this "God's covenant purpose was to chose a people in and through whom the world would be healed. That purpose, reaching its climax in the Messiah, is now to be worked out through his people". So, the question is who are God's people? What exactly is the Church?

The church is not some place you go; it is a community, a group you participate in. Anyone who has played a sport of any kind understands that the team meets together for "practice." That's what our Sunday meeting are, or the book group, they are for the teams to prepare to play the game. Remember the meetings are not the game. Christianityfollowing Jesus- is not lived, is not fully expressed, with in the walls of the church building but in the daily routines of our lives.

If I asked you to draw on a napkin your vision of the church, I would bet that it would be a square with a pointed roof and a cross on top? Right? What if instead you made a bunch of stick people, doing mission work, making meals, or sewing blankets, or better yet figures of different sizes, sexes, colors getting along, working together? What would that look like?

So, what would people say about us? What do people say about us? Better yet what do you say? If Jesus were here, would he be proud of the church we built?

I hope we all can start living our faith in the open community and not just within the walls of the building we are calling Church.

As we begin our discussions of ONA, I think we need to understand that it is a lot more than just agreeing to same sex marriages. Our ONA covenant should be written to express that all persons are welcome, regardless of their race, ethnicity, age, family structure, faith background, economic circumstances, as well as, sexual orientation and/or gender identity and expression. We do this now!

So, why do we need to formalize? People moving to town or searching for a church, especially young or blended families, will be looking for a church that has publicly declared that they are open and affirming. It is not enough anymore to just <u>say</u> we are welcoming to all.

People who have been marginalized or singled out may not want to risk coming to a church that has not gone through the ONA process. Some may bypass our church without giving it a second glance. And, as we search for a settled pastor, we need to firmly state whether or not we want our beliefs known.

Every single person in our congregation has a voice in this and deserves to be

heard. Whether you agree or not to one or more parts of the ONA designation, we need to listen to each other and decide, as a congregation.

Let's speak openly and honestly once we can get back together. And, most importantly, let's listen to each other.

There's a lot of fear and uncertainty in the world right now, a lot of things have changed or are changing that we believed would never change. A lot of things have happened to shake our faith in our world and perhaps even in God. That's why the title of this month's Nook Book Unafraid: Moving Beyond **Fear-based Faith** by Benjamin L. Corey, jumped off the virtual shelf.

Benjamin L. Corey, thought he was suffering a crisis of faith, but it turned out to be a spiritual awakening. He was in the Air Force, he was raised Christian, he had a degree in Theology and he knew what he believed, and that what he believed was right. Until things changed.


"Corey became aware that the constant fear of hell and judgment that defined his Christian faith was out of sync with the idea that God acts from love, and promises to deliver us from fear. In the wake of this realization came newfound insights. From reading the Bible to reexamining American life and the church's role in the wider world., he began to realize what he had been taught was a distorted version of Christianity that was not only untrue but caused real spiritual harm.

He also discovered that he wasn't alone. Many Christians are yearning to distinguish between the Christianity that has become a rigid American civil religion and the authentic Christian faith

embodied in Jesus. As he recounts his own spiritual journey, Corey offers a powerful and inspiring message of hope for every Christian increasingly frustrated with the church today. Do not be discouraged, he assures us. You do not need to give up your faith; you can rediscover the reality of a vibrant Christianity that delivers us from fear and inspires and quides us all today." Musical Notes - A Spirit who comforts

In a time when life expectancy was around 40 years, Hildegard of Bingen (1098-1179) lived more than twice that long. The Benedictine abbess and mystic wrote books and music, founded two convents, conducted four "preaching tours" and much more, despite chronic illness, lack of schooling, grave self-doubt and a male-dominated church and society. Perhaps these poetry excerpts reveal her source of strength and inspiration:

O comforting fire of Spirit, Life, within the very Life of all Creation. Holy you are in giving life to All. ...

O sacred breath, O fire of love ...
O most pure fountain
through whom it is known
that God has united strangers
and inquired after the lost. ...

You always draw out knowledge, bringing joy through Wisdom's inspiration.

Therefore, praise be to you who are the sound of praise and the greatest prize of Life, who are hope and richest honor bequeathing the reward of Light.

Search Committee: Congregational meetings planned

The Search Committee is meeting weekly. We are gathering information for our profile, which is a comprehensive picture of where we are, who we are and who we want to become as a church as we move forward with our search for a settled pastor.

We are planning congregational gatherings in socially distanced outdoor meetings and/or Zoom meetings to hear from our members rather than using written surveys.

We encourage everyone to attend one or more meetings and to share your thoughts about our direction and a new settled pastor. We hope everyone will participate in their meeting

and send additional comments to the committee.

In the next several weeks we will begin to put the collected data to "paper" as we prepare our profile.

The plan is to submit our profile to the UCC this fall so we are "published" as seeking a pastor/teacher no later than the first of the year.

We will begin reviewing the By-laws this fall as well to determine what updates and changes would be appropriate and present proposed new By-laws to the church for a vote at Annual Meeting. The last time our entire By-laws were updated was in 2011 and voted on at Annual Meeting

in 2012. There were 4 amendments adopted between then and now, which will be incorporated into one document.

Thanks to all for your continued support and your future input as we proceed with the congregational meetings very soon.

Meet your church: Pastoral Relations and Nominating

We've got two committees for you this month, starting with the Pastoral Relations Committee. This committee acts as a liaison between the Pastor and the congregation. The purpose is to provide support for the Pastor and maintain an ongoing and health relationship between the two. The committee also provides an ongoing evaluation of the Pastor and congregational ministry, reporting to the Diaconate.

The committee also negotiates yearly with the Pastor on compensation and benefits and makes recommendations to the Diaconate. Members to include the Moderator, a Deacon and two other members of the church. They meet twice per year.

The Nominating Committee is comprised of three members and is charged with preparing, prior to annual meeting, a slate of officers and committee members whose terms are expiring. The nominations are voted upon at the Annual Meeting. The Committee also nominates persons to fill any unexpired terms of office when needed. Again, the committee is comprised of three members.

Guidelines for in-person church services (subject to change)

Face masks are required and will be available if someone forgets theirs or doesn't have one.

Hand sanitizer will be available in convenient locations

Floors will be marked with tape at 6' intervals to help people with their social distancing

Temperature will be taken of everyone attending - any temp over 100.4 cannot be allowed in.

Attendance will be taken at each service

Deacons will seat people, seating from front to back - then at end of service leave back to front.

Pews will be marked with tape at 6' intervals to keep the social distancing. Family units can sit together, which may require a quick adjustment of the "other" 6' space

Bulletins will already be in the pews - bibles and hymnals have been removed. Please bring your own Bible from home instead.

Offerings can be left in the pew or continued to be mailed in

While the weather is good - have windows and doors will be open .

People can sign up to be the responsive reader & scripture reader (they would do both). They would sit up front on the altar for the whole service and do their readings from there. There is still more than 6' of distance with Kerry up there also.

The bathrooms – cleaner is available for people to wipe down areas before and after their use.

If you test positive for the coronavirus, please stay home.

Do not come if you don't feel well.

Do not come if you exhibit any symptoms of sickness, including sore throats, coughing, fevers, etc. Please keep us all safe

Please tell us if you test positive for the coronavirus.

Thank you for your cooperation as we work through all of this together.

Guidelines will be strictly adhered to and are subject to changes. People not respecting the guidelines will be asked to leave.

Matching donations
