"I will make my covenant between you and me" Gen 7:2 NRSV

The Mayflower Compact was the first covenant in North American history, written in 1620. "We solemnly and mutually, in the presence of God, and one another, covenant and combine ourselves together into a civil body politic."

Today, an Open and Affirming covenant is more than a statement, policy, declaration or an amendment to a congregation's by-laws. In the UCC's Reformed tradition, a covenant is an *act of faith*, a solemn promise to God in response to God's holy Word. An ONA covenant is a serious step for a congregation in its life of faith.

A church's covenant is a firm, public declaration of that church's intentions to serve one another and its

community. Here is an example of a covenant of the Plainfield Congregation in Plainfield, IL:

We, the people of the Plainfield Congregational United Church of Christ, seek to be a community of Christians who celebrate and live in openness to the voice of the Still Speaking God. We celebrate the beauty and uniqueness of each expression of God's diverse family as well as our oneness in Christ. As we seek to live out our mission to "live Christ's compassion and promote justice, healing and wholeness of life" we welcome into our community persons of every gender, sexual orientation, gender identity and expression, mental and physical ability, age, race, nationality, economic and social status, faith

background, marital standing and family structure; and we invite them to share in the life, leadership, ministry, fellowship, worship, sacraments, responsibilities, blessings and joys of our congregation as we seek to "grow together in faith and love."

What do we want our covenant to say to anyone looking at our church? Yes, we are warm and welcoming. But, how do we show that before someone sets foot in our door? Meet your church: Treasurer, Collector, Finance, and Auditor

As we prepare budgets for the upcoming year, this month is dedicated to our financial leaders. Starting with the Treasurer. The Treasurer receives and disburses all monies of the church. The Collector is in charge of collecting all funds that come into the church. Both the Treasurer and Collector present reports monthly. The two positions are cross-support for each other with the Collector serving as

Assistant Treasurer and vice versa. Both positions are bonded.

The Finance Committee has the responsibility for periodic review of the financial status of the church. It prepares the annual budget for the approval of the Church Council prior to Annual Meeting. The Committee is comprised of the Board of Trustees, three Deacons, Auditor, Collector and at least one member of the stewardship committee. Other interested parties may attend the budget meetings.

The Auditor examines the accounts of the Treasurer, Collector and of any other committee or organizations of the church. A written statement of findings is provided at Annual Meeting.

Guidelines for in-person church services (subject to change)

Face masks are required and will be available if someone forgets theirs or doesn't have one.

Hand sanitizer will be available in convenient locations

Floors will be marked with tape at 6' intervals to help people with their social distancing

Temperature will be taken of everyone attending - any temp over 100.4 cannot be allowed in.

Attendance will be taken at each service

Deacons will seat people, seating from front to back - then at end of service leave back to front,

Pews will be marked with tape at 6' intervals to keep the social distancing. Family units can sit together, which may require a quick adjustment of the "other" 6' space.

Bulletins will already be in the pews - bibles and hymnals have been removed. Please bring your own Bible from home instead.

Offerings can be left in the pew or continued to be mailed in

While the weather is good - have windows and doors will be open .

People can sign up to be the responsive reader & scripture reader (they would do both). They would sit up front on the altar for the whole service and do their readings from there. There is still more than 6' of distance with Kerry up there also.

The bathrooms – cleaner is available for people to wipe down

areas before and after their use.

Do not come if you don't feel well.

Do not come if you exhibit any symptoms of sickness, including sore throats, coughing, fevers, etc. Please keep us all safe.

If you test positive for the coronavirus, please stay home.

Please tell us if you test positive for the coronavirus.

Thank you for your cooperation as we work through all of this together.

Guidelines will be strictly adhered to and are subject to changes. People not respecting the guidelines will be asked to leave.

Many ways to give

As a hen and a pig walked down the road, they noticed a church sign advertising a breakfast of "Ham and Eggs!"

"That's nice," said the hen. "A chance for us to serve the congregation."

"Easy for you to say," replied the pig. "For you, it's a contribution; for me, it's a sacrifice!"

Versions of this story appear on inspirational websites, with comments about the chicken being *involved* in breakfast, while the pig is *committed*. Opinions differ, however, about which animal has the right idea. Some people warn against being the pig, sacrificing yourself for success; others say the chicken isn't all-in.

"People who give themselves to Jesus with a trusting abandon" are like pigs, says Rick Lawrence in *The Jesus-Centered Life* (Group). That total, "without reservation" commitment, he says, shows a willingness to give your life to Jesus — as he gave his for you.

On the other hand, giving consistently, day in and day out, even in what might seem to be small ways, also is valuable. Maybe the moral is not to judge others' stewardship because we all give differently. NN 8.19
