Annual Meeting re-cap

If you missed the church's Annual Meeting in January, below are a few highlights.

The budget was passed, but there is a deficit of approximately \$23,000 between pledges and expected expenses. Pledges were down

in numbers and values. There were 29 pledges this year vs 35 last year. An extended discussion of the increased importance of fundraising followed, as well as some suggestions for increasing rental revenue.

Our Churches 200th anniversary in 2023 and there will be several events held throughout the year to celebrate.

A moment of silence was held to honor members Marilyn Bartsch and Clayton Brown who passed away last year.



Lenten Signals

Why should we observer Lent? This 40-day season of repentance and reflection that begins on Ash Wednesday has three important purposes. Lent helps us STOP, LOOK, and LISTEN.

We observe Lent because it tells us to STOP and rest a while - and to stop sinning. Lent tells us to LOOK inward for an honest selfexamination, too look upward to see the cross of Jesus with healing and lover, and to look forward to the hope of the Resurrection.

And we observe Lent because it tells us to LISTEN - to the voice of God, the words of Christ and the movement of the Holy Spirit. STOP, LOOK, and LISTEN! These commands that are so crucial for travel safety are also important for our journey through Lent.
