Missions - Fidget Blankets and more

Your mission dollars at work! Here is a sample of where your mission dollars are being used.



A donation was made to the family in Lyndeborough who have a young daughter currently receiving cancer treatments.

The Linus Blanket group continues to meet on the second and fourth Tuesdays of the month to work on blankets. We average about 10 blankets a month. These blankets range in size from infant through teenager size. There is a constant need for these blankets. They are distributed throughout the Monadnock Region to police, fire, rescue, Head start and hospitals to provide comfort to children who are traumatized or ill.

In February Missions met and made a big pot of chicken soup. The soup was delivered to some of our senior members. This will give us a chance to reach out to members we do not see often in person and visit. We will make soup again in March, on the 21st. If you want to help, please let someone on the Missions Committee know.

A request was received from the Rehabilitative Services department at St. Joseph's Hospital in Nashua for fidget blankets. These blankets, also called activity blankets or boards, are used as an alternative means to soothe and calm Alzheimer's and dementia patients. In collaboration with the Wilton Community Center, Missions will be offering a class on March 16 and 23 from 9:00 to noon. Everyone is invited to come. If you cannot come but would like to donate sewing notions such as buttons, zippers, rickrack, etc., please let Stephanie Ouellette know.


Musical Notes: Prove it!

In Jesus Christ, Superstar, King Herod mocks the bound prisoner who's brought to his courtyard. "So, you are the Christ. You're the great Jesus Christ!" he sings. "Prove to me that you're no fool: Walk across my swimming pool!"

Likewise, the Pharisees demand evidence that Jesus is speaking for God (see Matthew 12:38). It's easy to poke fun at them, but have you ever faced a tough decision and thought, "If only God would give me a sign"?

Jesus tells the religious teachers about the "sign of Jonah," a metaphor for his upcoming death and resurrection. Though it's meant to be a sign for all, not everyone accepts it as truth. Luke 16:31 notes that if the rich man's brothers weren't predisposed to listen to Moses and the prophets, then "they will not be convinced even if someone rises from the dead" (NIV). Signs are useful only to people who accept their messages and act accordingly.
