Old Home Days 2024



One of the challenges is losing track of things you need. The daily conversations at our house go like this: "Have you seen the Zip Lock bags anywhere?" "Where's the screwdriver?" "Have you run across the shade for this lamp yet?" "In which box did we pack the kitchen towels?" "How about the Crock Pot?" "Where are my sweaters and tennis shoes?" When you move into a house you clean and explore every nook and cranny. You decide what will go where. You move things around, try this and that, until the place becomes you. Gradually, over time,

It happens through faith, through being open to God's presence in our lives. Book Nook: Chicken Soup for the Soul

Chicago teacher Jack Canfield was having trouble persuading his inner-city students to want to learn. Many thought they were unable to grasp the lessons and many lacked self-confidence and motivation.

One day, while meditating, Canfield had a vision. What if he collected stories by or about people who had overcome obstacles of all sorts? Wouldn't that be like chicken soup for the soul?

Canfield joined with a friend, Mark Victor Hansen, and together they began to collect inspirational stories about people who had overcome handicaps or personal problems to succeed in life. They took the final collection to 140 book publishers before they found one that would print it. That book became a best seller and encouraged them to publish several other "Chicken Soup" books. There are now 100 million copies of these books in print.

Like the people in their books, Canfield and Hansen believed that they were led by the hand of God to share their inspiration. NN10.06

Thank you for a wonderful 2023

Church Missions would like to thank the entire congregation for generous responses to the projects we were involved in during 2023. Here is a partial list of what we did, with your support during the year:

- We purchased fleece, created and donated over 200 blankets to the Monadnock area Linus Project.
- * In the spring we cooked and delivered soups and lunches to some of our congregation's senior members.
- * With covid easing up we were able to host several in-person lunches during the year. Two were hosted to introduce Pastor Gary to the wider congregation.
- * During Domestic Abuse Awareness Month in October, we collected over four baskets of food and cleaning supplies and donated them to Bridges, the local women's shelter.

- In December we adopted two families through Bridges and purchased Christmas gifts from their "wish" lists.
- * A new group met during 2023 to make fidget blankets for dementia patients. As of the end of the year over 24 blankets to local nursing homes and adult day care. This group intends to continue meeting in 2024.


As the priest began reading the gospel lesson, however, I recognized the account of Jesus' baptism. It struck me powerfully that, because our denominations shared the same lectionary (series of Scripture readings for worship),

six hours later my pastor-father would be proclaiming this very passage at my home church. He would do so in a different language and to a different congregation, but it would be the same good news — indeed, the one gospel — proclaimed in *my* hearing.

I felt less homesick then, comforted that through Christ, the Scriptures and the church, I was connected with other Christians, even from far around the world.

The Challenge of Scripture

GQ magazine once included the Bible on a list of 21 books not worth reading, calling the text "repetitive" and "foolish" (among other things). Pushback came from both secular and religious folks. Writing in *USA Today*, Tim Swarens argued that even if you don't believe in God, the Bible helps you understand Western culture, history, current events and your neighbors.


For Christians, the Bible — God's inspired Word — reveals God's love and will. It isn't always easy to read or process, but no other book contains such good news.

As Danielle Shroyer writes in *Original Blessing*, "Scripture is a sacred book meant to provoke us in ways that will move us toward God. And often, that is the very last thing we are looking for. We would rather have an answer, a simple plan, even a nicely tidy moral story. But Scripture gives us none of these things, because the holy is anything but domestic. We go looking to find a plan and instead are sent on a treasure hunt." Published in: September 2018
