THE SEASON OF LENT

Today is the first Sunday in the season of Lent, which began this past week on Ash Wednesday. The word "Lent" is from an old English word *lencten*, meaning "spring." The word may also be related to the word for "lengthen," referring to the lengthening of days during the season of spring. Lent is traditionally observed for forty days (excluding Sundays) between Ash Wednesday and Easter.

The forty days commemorate the forty days Jesus spent fasting in the wilderness before beginning his public ministry. Lent is a time of reflection, self-examination, prayer, fasting, and renewal as we focus on Jesus' journey to the Cross and what it means for us as followers of Jesus. The Lenten journey ends in the joy and celebration of Easter.
