The Still Point of the Turning World

It happened a few weeks after we accepted the call to First
Congregational Church Nantucket.
One warm, sunny afternoon after we moved to Nantucket, Debra and I went out to Miacomet Beach. We walked a bit, then sat on the beach for a long while with the sea stretching before us. We drank in the beauty. The deep blue of the distant waters. Breakers rolling in. Bright teal-blue waves cresting, falling, cascading onto the shore. Sea gulls floating on the wind, then sweeping across the water.

Beyond the news of the world that makes the headlines, there is also what goes on in our personal lives from day to day. There are the battles we wage within ourselves — struggles with loneliness, boredom, insecurity, fear. There are struggles that happen in our relationships. For some, there are concerns with health or aging. Life is fragile and precarious, isn't it? Where is "the still point in a turning world"?

There on the beach it was as if time were suspended. The beauty of the present moment seemed all that really mattered. The poet T. S. Eliot has a wonderful phrase to describe that kind of moment. In his *Four Quartets* Eliot speaks of "the still point of the turning world." He says, "At the still point of the turning world. Neither flesh nor fleshless; Neither from nor towards; at the still point, there the dance is...."

Eliot is speaking of the present moment. What's important, he says, is to live in the present moment — "the still point of the turning world." "There the dance is," he says. There is life that can be celebrated.

I believe that being attentive to the present moment is a way we can experience the peace of God. In a world that is "turning" — constantly changing, fragile, uncertain — it is possible to experience God's presence.

As I sat on the beach on Nantucket that day, I thought about how fragile our lives and world are.

In the Gospel of John, Jesus says to his disciples, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you" (John 14:27). Jesus spoke those words to his disciples as he was about to leave them. Jesus offers the gift of peace to us as well. This is an inner peace, a tranquility of soul that is not dependent on external circumstances. This peace is the assurance of God's presence in our lives

How do you experience the "still point" of God's peace and presence? We don't have to go to the beach, the woods, up the highest mountain, or to the most beautiful place in the world to experience God's peace. It can happen anywhere, anytime. Jesus says, "My peace I give to you."

So take some time to sit, be still, and listen to the still point of the turning world.



Your Mission Dollars at Work

The March "Mission Possible" collection was \$220.00. Thank you for continuing to support our efforts.

Church Missions continues to support the Linus Blanket project. We have an average of 12 people come the second and fourth Tuesday of the month to help create beautiful blankets. From January through March we have completed and donated 69 blankets. If you would like to join our group, please speak to Stephanie Ouellette or Cindy Broderick.

The Fidget Blanket group continues to meet the first and third Tuesday of each

month. Through March we have completed and donated 23 fidget blankets. These were donated to local nursing homes. Another blanket was donated to Upreach, an equine rehabilitation center for use with their clients. Each blanket takes approximately 10 hours to complete. In April and May, the group is working on some to donate to area elementary schools. These blankets will provide comfort to children at the nurse's office, and in the classroom. We also are hoping to work with local occupational and physical therapists to develop blankets for use with their clients.

Lay Visitation Class

Pastor Gary and the Deaconate board will be offering a short series of classes on rVisitation and how to relate to those who are suffering. We will be using a book by Kenneth C. Hauck, Ph.D., "Don't Sing Songs to a Heavy Heart". This book is built on a strong biblical foundation, filled with practical ideas, to help find words and actions to bring God's loving presence to hurting people when they need it most.

Musical Notes: Pentecost Petals

The Pantheon, dedicated in 126 A.D. as the home of ancient Roman gods, is now a Catholic basilica. In a tradition dating back to the seventh century, on Pentecost Sunday thousands of rose petals are dropped through the roof's opening onto worshipers below. The red petals symbolize the Holy Spirit descending on Jesus' disciples, as well as the blood Jesus shed on the cross.

To accomplish this "rose rain," five firefighters climb to the roof after mass. While the choir sings the ancient hymn *Veni Creator Spiritus* ("Come Creator Spirit"), firefighters empty seven bags of petals through the building's 27-foot-wide oculus, or eye in the sky.

Only a fortunate few can witness this spectacular event in person each year, but videos are available online.

Aflame with Faith



In the Old Testament, fire often symbolizes the presence of God's Spirit. For example, God called to Moses from a burning bush (Exodus 3:2-6) and defeated the prophets of Baal on Mount Carmel (1 Kings 18:30-39). In the New Testament, tongues of fire rested atop the believers gathered on Pentecost (Acts 2:3).

Some Christians have described a burning or current-like sensation when they encounter God. Methodism founder John Wesley said his heart was "strangely warmed" during worship. After such an encounter, people often feel compelled to share the Good News of Jesus. The flame of faith inside one believer can spark a revival of faith in others. As Charles Spurgeon said, "A burning heart will soon find for itself a flaming tongue."
